Sue Atkins has not only inspired generations of lexicographers, but has also played a crucial role in developing links between the practical world of dictionary-making and the research communities of linguistics and natural language processing. The articles in this book were written in her honour by just a few of her many admirers.

This Festschrift was constructed around the vibrant keynote address that Sue Atkins gave at the EURALEX congress in Gothenburg in 1996, entitled Bilingual Dictionaries - Past, Present, and Future.
